

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Programme Structure

First Year of the Curriculum

- Students have to complete 60 ECTS (30 ECTS per semester)
- Including
 - core courses in methods, micro, macro, econometrics and maths and
 - specialization courses and supplementary courses

Second Year of the Curriculum

- Third semester (30 ECTS):
 - Students should complete coursework in all sections.
- Fourth semester (30 ECTS):
 - Writing and defending master thesis
 - Ideally, the thesis is the starting point of their first PhD research paper





Programme Structure: Our Recommendation

Focus on research topics within the specialization section and combine them with suited courses from other M.Sc. programs. Combine, for example,

- M.Sc. ER SM Modules "Advanced Behavioral Economics" and "Market Design and Mechanism Design" with 3 Modules from M.Sc. Economics:
 - SM Market Design and Behavior I-V (see Supplementary Section)
- M.Sc. ER SM Modules "Advanced Public Economics" and "Frictions, Technology, and Inequality" with 3 Modules from M.Sc. Economics:
 - SM Markets and Public Policy I-V (see Supplementary Section)



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M.Sc. Economic Research Sample Study Plan I






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M.Sc. Economic Research Sample Study Plan II

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Studies Abroad

The faculty's Study Abroad Programme (STAP):

- Plan and submit your term abroad application right at the beginning.
- Application deadline December 1st for the following academic year.
- Some suited partners: Amsterdam, Bocconi, Hitotsubashi, Kobe, KU Leuven, Maastricht

Exchange over faculties: Central International Office of the University of Cologne offers exchanges over different faculties.

Freemover: Organization of study abroad is done individually

- → 18 ECTS can directly be transferred in "Studies Abroad in Economic Research" in the <u>Supplementary Section</u>
- \rightarrow Further credit transfers possible for matching courses (e.g. 12 ECTS)



Cologne Graduate School

Transfer from M.Sc. Econ Res to the Dissertation Phase



- Transfer to dissertation phase contingent on **successful course phase**
- Commitment of a **supervisor** as a prerequisite for the dissertation phase
- CGS supports matching between students and supervisors





Outlook CGS

Dissertation Phase

Programme

- No further doctoral courses for MSc Econ Res students
- Regular participation and presentation in research seminars
- Participation in soft skill courses and summer schools

Funding

- Doctoral positions at research centers or faculty chairs
- Funding for research projects by research centers or chairs
- Facilities (rooms, IT etc.) at research centers or chairs

Further offers

- Workshops organized by doctoral students
- Conference participation funded by research centers or chairs
- Job market preparation
