in Summer 2019 with highest ratings: "The study concept is excellent and is oriented towards PhD programs of leading international universities."



Program Structure

First Year of the Curriculum

- students have to complete 60 ECTS (30 ECTS per semester)
- including
 - core courses in methods, micro, macro, econometrics and maths and
 - specialisation courses of the MSc. ER and doctoral courses

Second Year of the Curriculum

- third semester (30 ECTS):
 - students have to complete of coursework in the specialisation section
 - three supplementary courses from other MSc programmes.
- fourth semester (30 ECTS):
 - students write and defend their master thesis that can be the starting point of their first PhD research paper



Sample Study Plan I










Sample Study Plan II

Studies Abroad

The Wiso Faculty's Study Abroad Programme (STAP):

- Students should plan and submit their application for a term abroad at the beginning of their master studies.
- STAP main selection round takes place once a year with application deadline December 1st for the following academic year.



- Transfer to dissertation phase contingent on successful course phase
- Commitment of a supervisor as a prerequisite for the dissertation phase
