
PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Standard period of study: 4 semesters, full-time | Start: fall term | Degree title: Master of Science The master's programme carries 120 ECTS credits and comprises a Core and Advanced Section, a Specialisation Section, a Supplementary Section and a Master Thesis.



Total number of ECTS: 120 ECTS = 4 semester standard period of study

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A bachelor degree or equivalent with an overall grade of at least 2.7 (German grade). The degree must be worth at least 180 ECTS credits. Applicants must meet the following subject-related requirements:

- At least 18 ECTS credits in Sociology or Social Psychology
- At least 12 ECTS credits in Quantitative Methods in Social Sciences or Empirical Social Research or Statitics
- Language requirements: English language skills B2(CEFR)

SOCIOLOGY AND SOCIAL RESEARCH

Sociology and Social Research at the University of Cologne is a theory-driven, empirically oriented field of study. The programme therefore focuses not only on sociological theories but also on methods and statistics used in the social sciences. Keeping a close eye on requirements and changes in the world of work, it provides students with the necessary expertise, skills and methods to conduct research, judge research findings critically and take a responsible approach to their work. With respect to subject "Sociology" the University of Cologne is ranked No. 1 in Germany 2019 the second year in a row in the acknowledged Academic Ranking of World Universities (ARWU/ "Shanghai-Ranking").

corporations and personnel administration of corporations. Other opportunities present themselves in local government e.g. in departments responsible for school, family, urban or environmental policy, as well as provincial and federal agencies. Graduates possess skills that qualify them for senior civil posts in Germany and leading positions in social and market research as well as social planning.
